A SMOOTHER PATH TO A **BRIGHTER FUTURE.**

Certain young people may qualify for expedited enrollment, which accelerates their application process and entry into Job Corps, if they are:

- Experiencing homelessness
- Survivors of severe trafficking
- Victims of natural or man-made disasters

HOW DOES EXPEDITED ENROLLMENT WORK?

- Applicants can self-attest to many of Job Corps' eligibility criteria—including age, U.S. citizenship/resident/work authorization status, and income level—and provide documentation later. They can immediately start living and learning on a Job Corps campus after completing a background check and health review.
- **2.** After self-attesting for one or more criteria, an applicant is deemed conditionally eligible and can continue with the next steps in the admissions process.
- **3.** Once an expedited student arrives on campus, Job Corps staff will verify their self-attested aspects of eligibility by obtaining relevant documentation within 90 days.

TALK TO AN ADMISSIONS REPRESENTATIVE TO LEARN WHETHER YOUR STUDENT QUALIFIES FOR EXPEDITED ENROLLMENT.

For Veterans, Transitioning Service Members and Military Spouses: Job Corps also offers priority enrollment for those who have been separated, regardless of discharge type, as well as their eligible spouses.

For Youth Exiting Foster Care: If your student has been in the foster care system in the last six months, they are automatically eligible for the program.
